DDCF, Thailand: In a nutshell (November 2025)

Established on 25 August 2011 as a not-for-profit organization under Thai Civil and Commercial Code, the Department of Disease Control Foundation (DDCF) aims to contribute to the strengthening of the prevention and control of diseases and health hazards of Thailand. The Foundation intends to utilize professional wisdom and knowledge to work together primarily with the Department of Disease Control of Thai Ministry of Public Health (DDC/MOPH/THA) as well as with relevant partner organizations and individuals.

Objectives:

1. To develop managerial systems for the prevention and control of diseases and health hazards of Thailand.
2. To promote knowledge management, research and development which are relevant to the problem-solving efforts regarding diseases and health hazards of Thailand.
3. To develop human resources on the prevention and control of diseases and health hazards of Thailand.
4. To operate, or co-operate with other charitable organizations, for public benefits.
5. To not engage in politics.

Governance (since April 2023):

The DDCF is governed by an 8-member Committee, legally registered on 24 Apr 2023 as follows:

The Chairperson, Dr Manit Teeratantikanont, is the former Director General (2009 – 2011) of DDC/MOPH/THA. The Vice Chairperson, Dr Supamit Chunsuttiwat is a senior technical advisor to the DDC/MOPH/THA. The Member and Secretary, Dr Sophon Iamsirithaworn, is a Deputy Permanent Secretary of the MOPH/THA whereas the Member and Treasurer, Dr Ariya Bunngamchairat, is a faculty member of the Faculty of Public Health, Mahidol University. All other members of the Committee had been senior professional staff at the DDC/MOPH/THA.

Example of key projects: Completed and On-going

1. **Completed:** A three-year project (2013-2016) on “Service providers’ programs for maternal HIV disclosure to children in Thailand”, funded by UCLA/USA
2. **Completed:** Training courses on “Growing Expertise in E-health Knowledge and Skills - GEEKS” in 2017 and 2019. These were collaborative projects participated by US CDC, Mahidol University of Thailand, the Thai Ministry of Public Health, and DDCF.
3. **Completed:** Digital Platform for Disease and Health Threat Surveillance Pilot Project. This project was active during May 2022 until June 2023, funded by the Broadcasting and Telecommunications Research and Development Fund for Public Interest (BTRF/NBTC), Thailand.
4. **Completed:** Capacity building and strengthening of the surveillance system on Adverse Effects Following Immunization and Vaccine Effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines. This one-year project was started on 6 December 2021 and completed by 31 December 2022. Funds for this project were donated by AstraZeneca (Thailand) Co. Ltd. and Zuelig Pharma (Thailand) Co. Ltd.
5. **Completed:** Digital Results Improve Vaccine Equity (DRIVE Demand) Project in Thailand. This multi-country project sought to accelerate vaccination demand generation, access & uptake with digital tools. This was a collaborative project within Thailand’s contexts among 4 parties, i.e. DDCF, DDC/MOPH/THA, PATH corporation/USA, and The Rockefeller Foundation (RF)/USA. It was funded by RF through PATH’s Digital Square and was active during June 2023 until August 2024.
6. **On-going:** Strengthening of the systems and human resources for the surveillance, investigation, prevention and control of respiratory communicable diseases through cooperative integration among key units in charge of responding to diseases and health hazards, 2023. Funds for this project were donated by AstraZeneca (Thailand) Co. Ltd. This project was started on 14 Dec 2022 and would last until December 2025.
7. **On-going:** Assessing adoption and use of the 7-1-7 target for effective detection, notification and early response to public health events: a mixed-methods study in Thailand. Funds for this project were granted by Resolve to Save Lives, Inc. (“RTSL”), a not-for-profit organization focused on global health established under the laws of the State of Delaware, USA. Activity dates of the project would be 2 Feb 2025 until 31 Oct 2025.
8. **On-going:** PREACTS - ASAMCO (abbreviation for PREZODE in ACTION in the Global South – specifically in Asia, America, and Congo) (remarks: PREZODE stands for Preventing Zoonotic Disease Emergence). Funds for this project were awarded by the Research Institute for Development (IRD), France. Activity dates of the project would be 26 May 2025 until 01 September 2028.

DDCF’s policy on organizational fee

In order to effectively run a collaborative project funded by partner organizations, the DDCF Committee made a resolution in its meeting on 19 July 2023 to collect “organizational fee” (in other words: management/ administration/ overhead fee) at the rate of 10% of the total approved budget. This is to cover the Foundation’s administrative costs.
